

OSCE Checklist: Combined Oral Contraceptive Pill (COCP)

1	Wash your hands and don PPE if appropriate	
2	Introduce yourself to the patient including your name and role	
3	Confirm the patient's name and date of birth	
4	Check the patient's understanding of the types of contraception available	
5	Explore the reasons why the patient wants the COCP	
Ideas, concerns and expectations		
6	Explore what the patient currently understands about the COCP	
7	Ask if the patient has any concerns about the COCP	
8	Explore the patient's expectations of the COCP

9	Explain what the COCP is	
10	Explain how the COCP works	
11	Explain the effectiveness of the COCP	
12	Explain the advantages of the COCP (non-invasive, effective, lighter periods, control timing of periods, improves acne, reduced risk of ovarian/uterine/colon cancer)	
13	Explain the disadvantages of the COCP (breakthrough bleeding, no protection from STIs, user dependent)	
14	Explain the risks of the COCP (venous thromboembolism, breast cancer, cervical cancer)	
15	Explain the contraindications of the COCP

16	Explain how to start taking the COCP	
17	Explain how to manage missed pills

18	Summarise the key points back to the patient	
19	Ask the patient if they have any questions or concerns that have not been addressed	
20	Direct the patient to any websites or leaflets with further information	
21	Arrange appropriate follow-up
