

OSCE Checklist | Male Lower Urinary Tract Symptoms

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O	pening the consultation	
1	Wash your hands and don PPE if appropriate	
2	Introduce yourself to the patient including your name and role	
3	Confirm the patient's name and date of birth	
4	Explain that you'd like to take a history from the patient	
5	Gain consent to proceed with taking a history	
Pr	esenting complaint	
6	Use open questioning to explore the patient's presenting complaint	
Hi	story of presenting complaint	
7	Onset: clarify how and when the urinary symptoms started	
8	Character: ask about the specific characteristics of the urinary symptoms (storage vs voiding symptoms)	
9	Associated symptoms: ask if there are any other associated symptoms (e.g. pain, haematuria, fever)	
10	Time course: ask how the urinary symptoms have changed over time (e.g. constant vs episodic symptoms)	
11	Exacerbating or relieving factors: identify any triggers for the urinary symptoms and ask if anything makes them worse or better	
12	Identify any red flags for malignancy (prostate cancer, bladder cancer)	
13	Explore the patient's ideas, concerns and expectations	
14	Summarise the patient's presenting complaint	
Sy	stemic enquiry	
15	Screen for relevant symptoms in other body systems	
Pa	ast medical history	
16	Ask about other medical diagnoses and previous surgical history (e.g. prostate/bladder surgery)	
17	Ask if the patient has any allergies and if so, clarify what kind of reaction they had to the substance	
Di	rug history	
18	Ask if the patient is currently taking any prescribed medications or over-the-counter remedies	
19	Ask if the patient if they're experiencing any side effects from their medication	
Fa	mily history	
20	Ask if there is any relevant family history of urological problems or malignancy	

Social history				
21	Explore the patient's general social context (accommodation, who the patient lives with, how the patient manages with activities of daily living, care needs)			
22	Take a smoking history			
23	Take an alcohol history			
24	Ask about recreational drug use			
25	Ask about the patient's occupation and identify any risk factors for bladder cancer			
CI	Closing the consultation			
26	Summarise the salient points of the history back to the patient and ask if they feel that you've missed anything			
27	Thank the patient for their time			
28	Dispose of PPE appropriately and wash your hands
