- 2. Extracapsular neck of femur fracture
- 3. Schizophrenia
- 4. Atrial fibrillation
- 5. Testicular torsion
- 6. Aneurysmal subarachnoid haemorrhage
- 7. Variceal upper gastrointestinal bleed
- 8. Traumatic right-sided tension pneumothorax
- 9. Pancreatic cancer
- 10. Rheumatoid arthritis

Note: Some rows on the table may have more than one correct potential differential diagnosis. If you identify a differential that does not match our answers, you should take some time to consider what additional information is needed to differentiate between our answer and your answer. This is a good exercise in clinical reasoning too.
